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# INSTRUMENTATION

- Instrument is the generic term that researchers use for a **measurement device** (checklist, test, questionnaire).
- Instrumentation is the **course of action** (the process of developing, testing, and using the device).

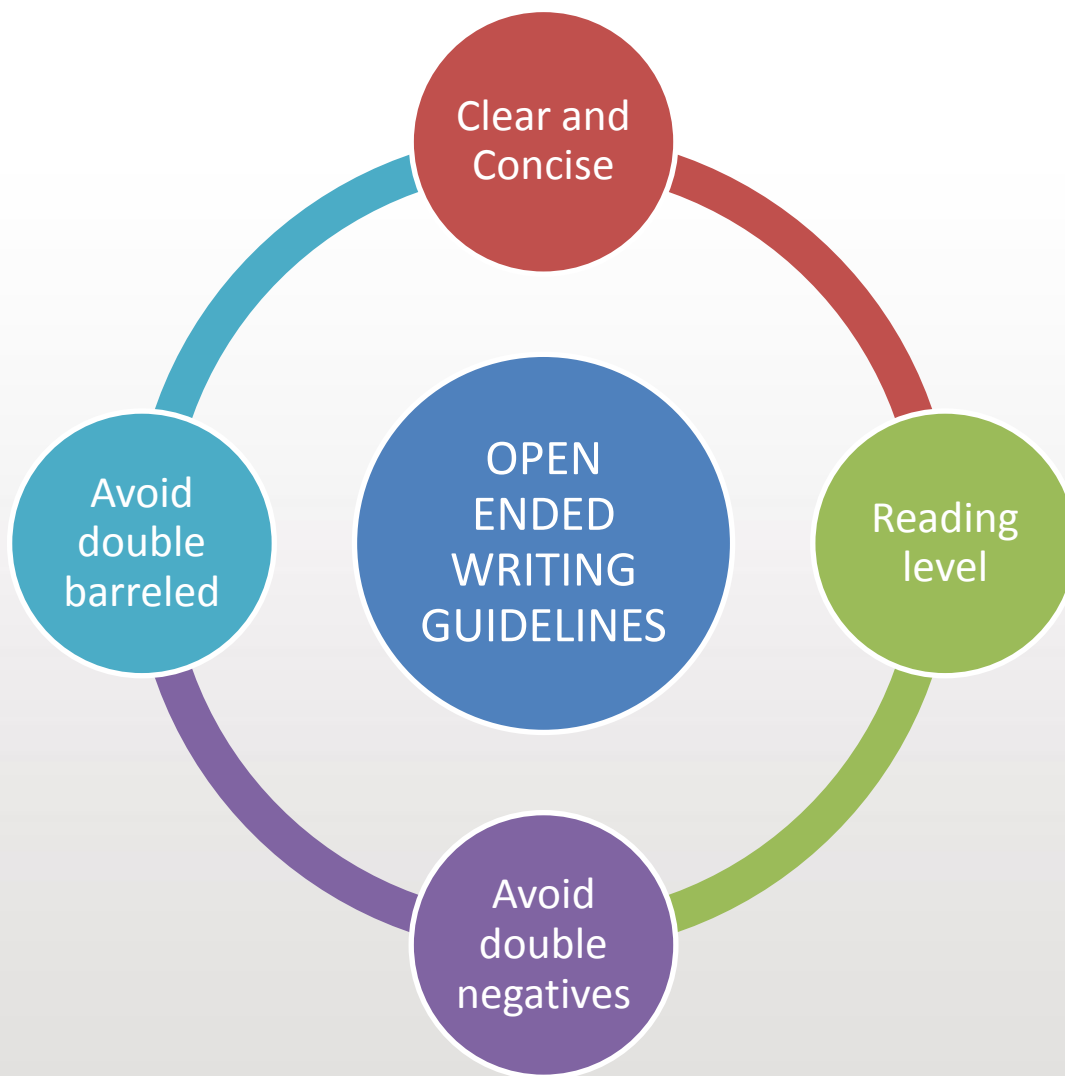

# OPEN ENDED QUESTIONS

- **Open ended questions** :- when there are a great number of possible answers or researchers cannot predict all the possible answers



# OPEN ENDED QUESTIONS

- Open-ended questions are useful to **explore a topic in depth** however, open-ended questions are difficult to

(i) Respond and (ii) Analyze.

- Therefore, **limit** the number of open-ended questions to the needed minimum.



# CLOSED ENDED QUESTIONS

- **Closed ended questions:-** all the possible, relevant responses to a question can be specified and the number of possible responses is limited
- Example- gender, ethnic, educational level



# CLOSED ENDED QUESTIONS

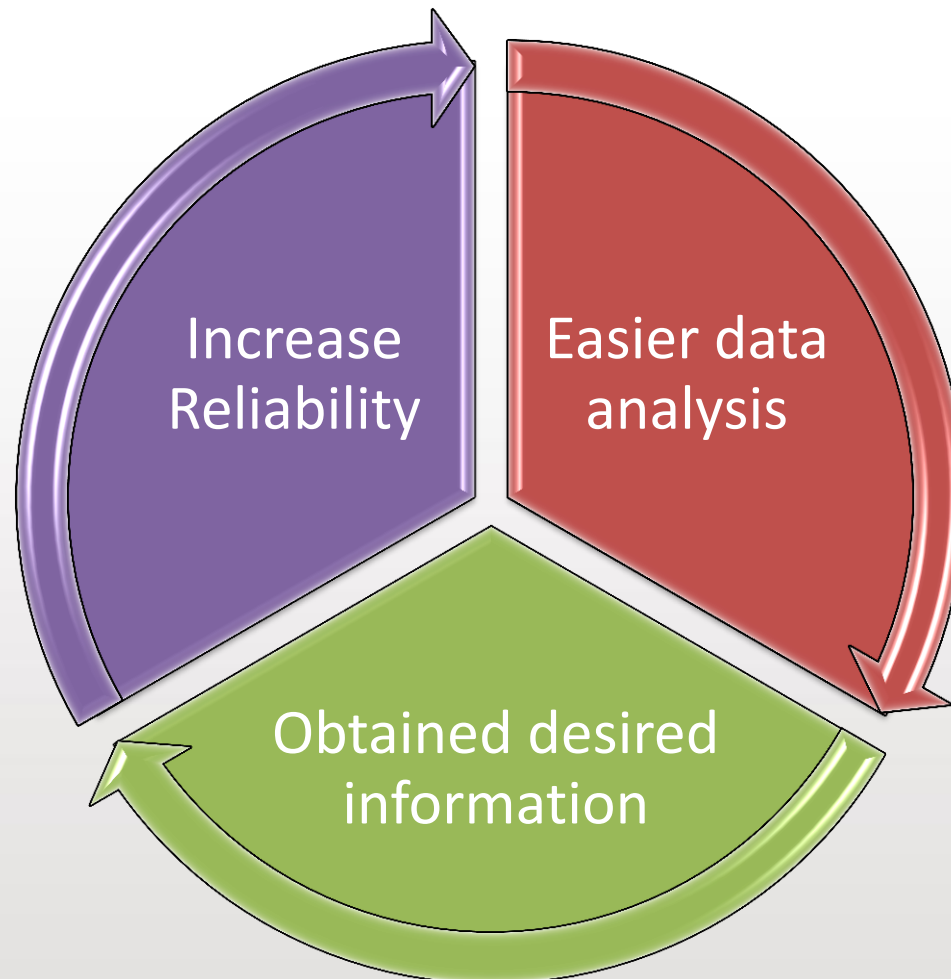
- **Make sure that your answer categories are mutually exclusive.**
- **Example: What is your age group?**
  - a) **Less than 20 years**
  - b) **20-30 years**
  - c) **31-40 years**
  - d) **41-50 years**
  - e) **Above 50 years**



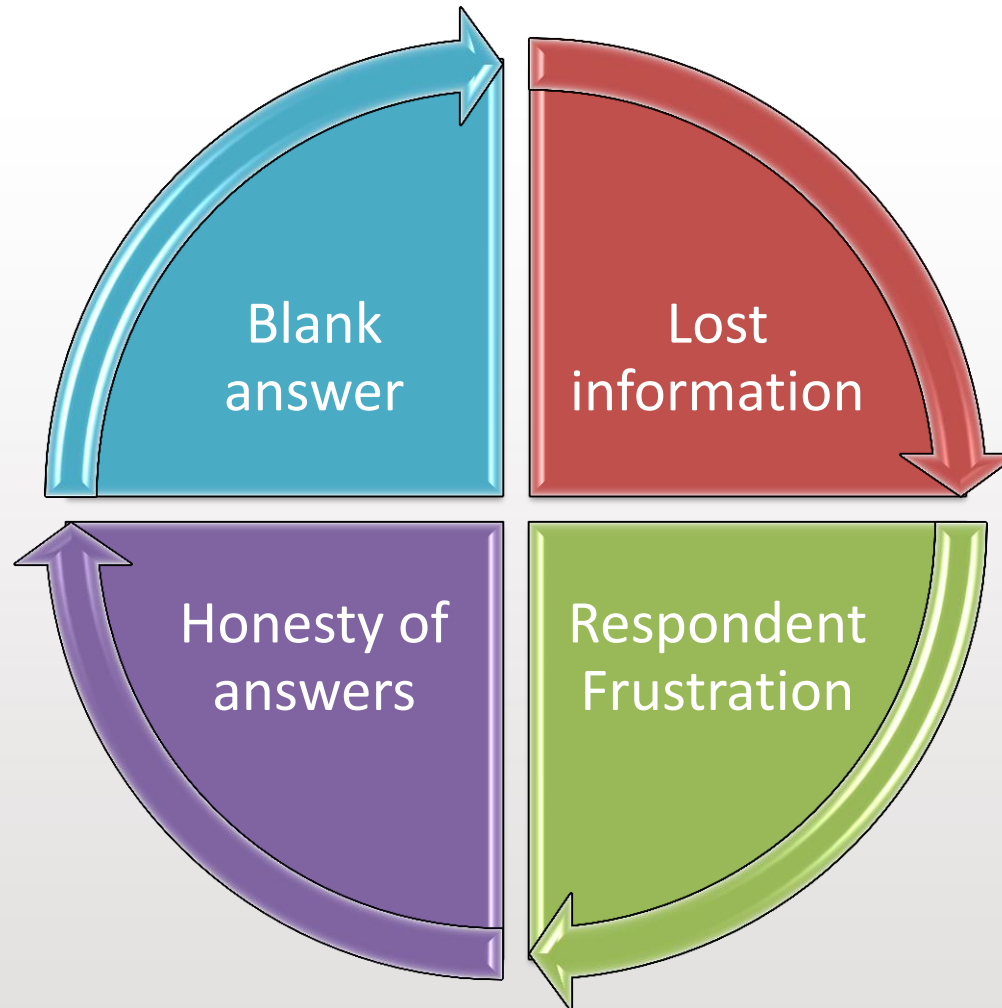
# CLOSED ENDED QUESTIONS

2. Are you a smoker? (*'yes' or 'no' answer*)
3. Please indicate your annual income level for the previous year:
  - a) RM 0.00 to RM10,000.00

  - c) RM 35,000.01 and above

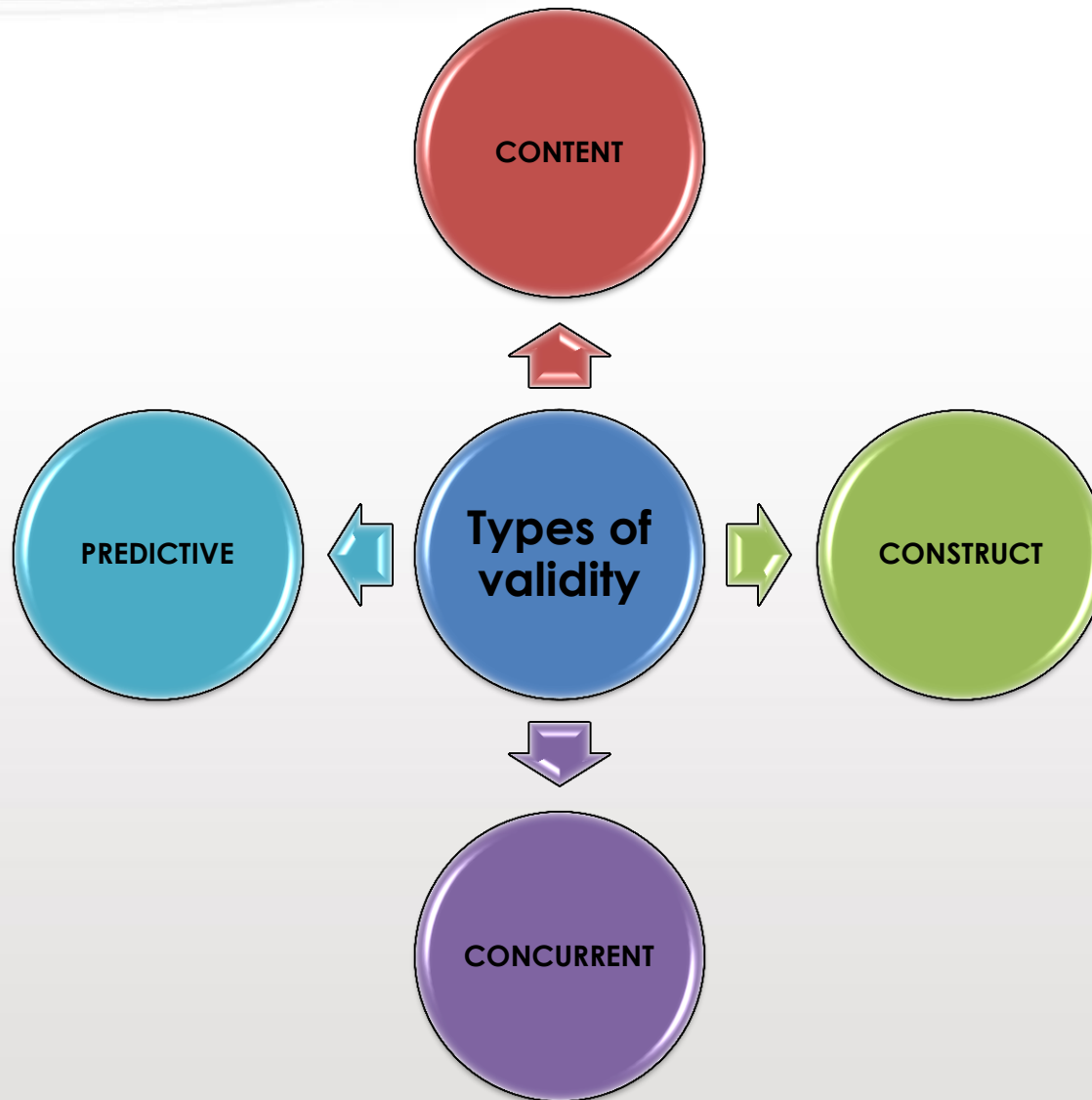

# VALIDITY

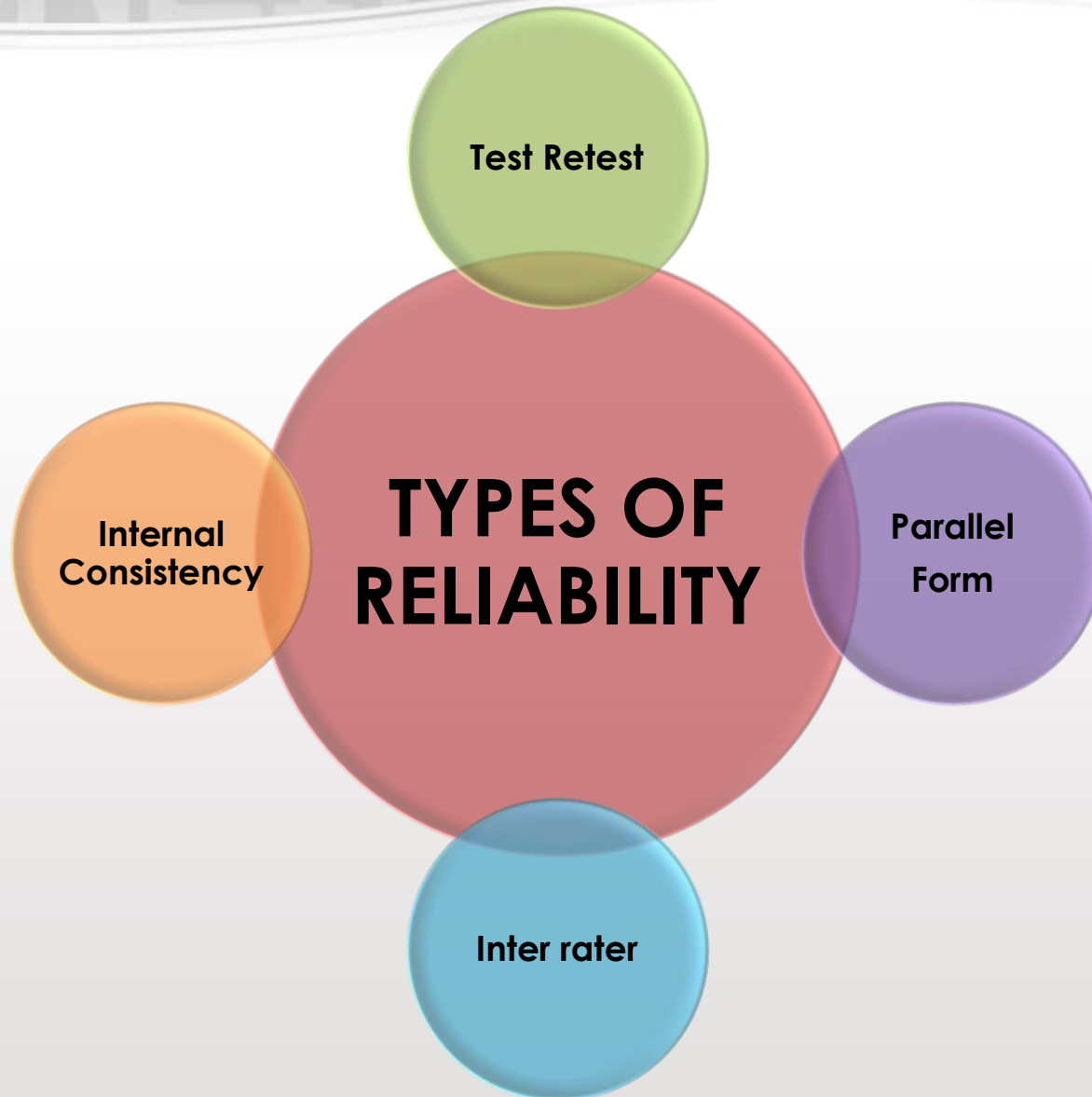
- **How well test measure what it is designed to measure**
- **The process of validation involves accumulating evidence to provide scientific basis for the proposed score interpretations**





# RELIABILITY

- Refers to the consistency of a measure
- For example, if a test is designed to measure a trait (such as creativity), then each time the test is administered to a subject, the results should be approximately the same.
