



# Qualitative Research Design: Narrative Research

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## What is narrative research? [1]

- Collection of stories from individuals about individuals' lived and told experiences.
- The story emerges through the interactions or dialogues between the researcher and the participant(s) – has a collaborative feature.
- Narrative stories highlight individual experiences accentuates unique identities.

## What is narrative research? [2]

- Narrative stories follow a chronology of events focuses on the microanalytic picture.
- The stories usually consist of turning points highlighting tensions or interruptions.
- Narrative stories are contextualised presented within particular places or situations.

# The key characteristics of narrative research [1]

| Characteristics                        | Narrative Research  |
|--|---|
| Focus                                  | Exploring the life of an individual.  |
| Type of problem best suited for design | Needing to tell stories of individual experiences.  |
| Discipline<br>background               | Drawing from the humanities (anthropology, literature, history, psychology, and sociology). |
| Unit of analysis                       | Studying one or more individuals.   |

# The key characteristics of narrative research [2]

| Characteristics          | Narrative Research   |
|--------------------------|--|
| Data collection forms    | Using primarily interviews and document.   |
| Data analysis strategies | Analysing data for stories, "restorying" stories, and developing themes, often using a chronology. |
| Written report           | Developing a narrative about the stories of an individual's life.                                  |




