



CHAPTER 2 EARLY HISTORY OF GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING





- Counseling emerged a developed as an American Product. Some claim that the American social environment, strongly influenced by the belief in the importance of the individual, was especially congenial to its development.
- 19th century Industrial Revolution happened.
 - ✓ Human changed.
 - ✓ Job profile changed.
- Consequences:
 - ✓ Job fields increased.
 - ✓ Many young people depressed.
 - ✓ Not enough preparation in term of working skill.
- Early stages focus on :
 - ✓ Working exercise
 - ✓ Surfaced guidance awareness towards 'Overall Growth of Individual Awareness'



Boston

- Beginning of vocational guidance.
- Boston is the Cradle of Vocational Guidance
- Books written:
 - 1. "Starting In Life"; Nathaniel C. Flower (1906)
 - 2. "What Can a Young Man Do"; Frank W. Rollins (1907)
- There were "Civic Service House" volunteers.
- The famous "Frank Parsons":
 - ✓ Interested in school leavers youth.

1905 - 1906:

- ✓ Parson established "Bread Winner's Institute"
- ✓ Started to developed vocational guidance.
- ✓ Organized a few programmes in "Choosing A Vacation"



1908:

- ✓ Established "Vocation Bureau of Boston"
- ✓ Received support and donation from society.
- ✓ The word "Bureau Director" was used for the first time (May 1908)
- According to Parson, in order to choose a job wisely, one has to:
 - Understand his/ her own self
 - ii. Knowledge is needed in career
 - iii. The ability to think logically in job world.
- Known as the "Father of Guidance"



New York City

- For public school children.
- Headed by High School Teachers Association (Eli W. Weaver)

Philadelphia

- In 1909, Pennsylvania approved the 'Labor Law for Women and Minor'
- Consumer's League of Philadelphia organized Industrial Betterment Bureau
- Purpose:
 - 1. To report those who broke to the law.
 - 2. To provide guidance and relocation services to young people.



Cincinnati

From philanthropic organization.

In 1911, educational departments introduced vocational guidance

service in public schools.



Chicago

- Received sponsorship from varieties of authorities.
- In 1911, Civic Club of Chicago conduct guidance activity actively.
- Chicago Association of Commerce active in providing vocational guidance for male students.
